PRE-REQUISITES

Equestrian Nova Scotia Membership

A current Equestrian NS membership is required during the program.

Age.

Students may begin the program as early as July of the year in which they enter grade 10 (i.e. Rider Level). However, students must be 16 years old or older to be eligible to take the evaluation.

Rider Level or Learn to Drive Program

The Rider Level Program is a measure of athlete development which is used for recreational and competitive students as well as the development of the Coaching Program. Information included in the Rider Level Program is one of the resources used to develop lesson plans to help athletes develop their riding skills.

For English you will need to pass Learn to Ride 6

For Western you will need to pass Learn to Ride 4

There is a riding component, stable management component, and written component that make up the Rider Level Test. You may challenge some of the Rider Levels. However, some restrictions apply. Please discuss challenging a level with your coach or an Equestrian NS Staff Member.

For Drive you will need to complete the Learn to Drive Program (13 modules).

<u>First Aid/CPR</u>

A current Standard First Aid with CPR Certificate must be submitted to Equestrian Nova Scotia. This certification must remain current throughout the program.

EC Registered Coach Status:

Completion of the Registered Status requirements (i.e. screening, insurance, etc) and payment of status fee.

Make Ethical Decisions Online Evaluation (MED Online Evaluation)

This evaluation helps coaches identify the legal, ethical, and moral implications of difficult situations that present themselves in the world of team and individual sport. A Pass is required. By taking the Making Ethical Decisions Module of the Equestrian Theory Course, students will be better prepared to take the online evaluation. This multisport evaluation is done online at www.coach.ca. To take the evaluation:

- Go to coach.ca on the right hand side there is a grey "My Locker" menu bar. In this menu, choose the "elearning" option. This will take you to the Locker Login Screen.
- If you have a NCCP Coaching number (NCCP#) then you will need to put it in or look it up. You **may** have a NCCP# if you coach another sport, taken coach training modules, or from taking/registering the Equestrian Theory Course.
- If you don't have a CC#, click on the link below the log in area to register with The Locker and follow the instructions.
- If you have difficulty with the log in or registration process, email coach@coach.ca
- Once logged in choose the Making Ethical Decisions Evaluation from the e-learning options on the left hand side of the screen.

Please note if you complete the MED Online Evaluation before taking the Making Ethical Decisions Training Module, there is an non-refundable \$85 fee to take the evaluation. If you take the NCCP Make Ethical Decisions module before taking the MED Online Evaluation then the MED Online is free. Candidates can take the Make Ethical Decision Module through the Equestrian Theory Course or through a multi-sport training.

CAC Safe Sport Module

This module contains information on Safe Sport and the standards for safe sport. This module is available online at www.coach.ca under e-learning. Follow the MED Online Evaluation directions above to access e-learning where you will find the Safe Sport Module.

NCCP Making Head Way in Sport concussion module The importance of understanding concussions as a coach at any level cannot be understated. The Making Head Way in Sport is an award winning eLearning resource for recognizing concussion and implementing proper return to play protocols. There are serious implications of undiagnosed concussions and improper return to play protocols which can affect the long-term wellbeing of an athlete. Making Head Way in Sport is an online learning tool designed to help coaches gain the knowledge and skills required to ensure the safety of their athletes. This NCCP Module covers: What to do to prevent concussions, how to recognize the signs and symptoms of a concussion, what to do when you suspect an athlete has a concussion, how to ensure athletes return to play safely. To take the module:

- Go to coach.ca on the right hand side there is a grey "My Locker" menu bar. In this menu, choose the "elearning" option. This will take you to the Locker Login Screen.
- If you have a NCCP Coaching number (NCCP#) then you will need to put it in or look it up. You may have a NCCP# if you coach another sport, taken coach training modules, or from taking/registering the Equestrian Theory Course.

Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Status or Alternative Screening where applicable

The Criminal Records Check or alternative screening where applicable can be completed through the EC Registered Coach Status for free. If you have completed a Criminal Records Check elsewhere, please contact us to discuss if it would be eligible.

Signed Code of Ethics & Code of Conduct

This document can be found in the Student Package or by contacting Equestrian NS (contact information below) Candidates will need to read and sign the document. There are two Codes within the four pages so there are two pages you will need to sign. These are then submitted to the Equestrian NS for your file.

Equine Canada Bronze Sport License

To be obtained by the student just prior to the evaluation. To purchase an EC Bronze Sport License, go to http://equestriancanada.ca, where you can process the sport license online or mail an application to Ottawa.

TRAINING: Theory Course (4 modules - 16 hours total) & 55 Hour Mentoring Program

NCCP Theory Course (Multi-sport and Equine Specific Modules)

The course is made up of four modules – 2 Multi-sport and 2 Equine Specific.

The multi-sport modules are available through either online or classroom courses or homestudy options.

Mentor Program

There are two components to the Equestrian NS High School Credit Instructor Mentor Program.

The Equestrian NS High School Credit Instructor Mentor Program includes 55 mentoring hours which are recorded through the Mentor Program Log Sheets. The candidate may complete these with their own coach, at an Equestrian NS Clinic, or with another coach. Students are encouraged to mentor with multiple coaches. The student must use an Equestrian NS Accredited Mentor to complete the Mentor Report Form. If the candidate's mentor coach is not an Equestrian NS accredited mentor then they can set up a day with an accredited mentor on their own or with Equestrian NS's assistance. The Mentor Report Form outlines the various criteria and evidences for the Instructor Evaluation. The mentor will indicate if it is felt that the student has met or not met the standards of the criteria and evidences. This will indicate to the student if there are areas for improvement or if they are prepared to proceed to the evaluation.

Both forms are pre-requisites for the Equestian NS High School Personal Development Instructor Program and must be submitted to Equestrian NS. Students are encouraged to keep a copy for their records.

Ideally, the mentor program should be completed with a **Current, NCCP Certified** Equestrian Instructor/Coach. However, we acknowledge that in some areas of this province it is not possible to do 55 hours with a certified coach. Students will work with a mentor to complete the mentoring component of the Equestrian NS Instructor High School Personal Development Credit. Equestrian NS also offers training opportunities which will provide mentoring with Certified Coaches. A Current, NCCP Certified Equestrian Instructor/Coach will need to work with a student to complete the evaluation phase of the Mentor (which includes the completion of the Mentor Report Form).

EVALUATION:

A PASS IS REQUIRED - Upon completion and submission of the pre-requisites to the Equestrian NS, please complete the evaluation application form.

The evaluation is completed in steps, outlined below. Information on how each of those steps is evaluated is outline in the Evaluation Rubrics. The cost of the Evaluation is dependent on the travel of the evaluator but is often in the range of \$200-300 plus travel expenses.

Evaluation Step 1 Evaluation Step 2 (Practical Evaluation)

Segments include: 3 Teaching lessons and stable management skills evaluated at a one-day event:

1. One Lesson Plan 1. Mounted Group Lesson

2. Emergency Action Plan (EAP) 2. Mounted lunge Lesson to a beginner rider/driver.

3. Unmounted Lesson

4. Stable Management including written test

Optional Evaluation Step 3 (English Jump Module)

Evaluated on the same day as the Evaluation Step 2

- 1. One Jump Lesson Plan
- 2. One Practical Evaluation Jump Lesson
- 3. Written Test

Cost: An evaluation fee will be determined based on factors including, but not limited to, evaluator fees, facility fees, and administrative fees.
